### Directions:

*From Downtown Pittsburgh:* Penn or Liberty Ave. to Strip District, left onto 16th St. and cross the 16th St. Bridge. At third stop light turn right on to Troy Hill Rd. We are 200 yds. on the left.

*From the North:* I-79 to I-279 South to exit 8B (East St.). Straight to the third light, then turn left on to East Ohio St. At the second light turn left on to Chestnut St., then immediate right on to Troy Hill Rd.

*From the East:* PA Turnpike to exit 6 (Pittsburgh), follow I-376 West (the Parkway) to the center of Pittsburgh (the Point) then follow I-279 North. Take exit 7C (Chestnut St.) onto Route 28 for about 100 yds. then exit to the right for Chestnut Street. At the end of the exit ramp, turn left on to Chestnut St., straight ahead to second stop light and turn right on to Troy Hill Rd.

*From the West:* I-279 North through the Ft. Pitt Tunnels and Ft. Pitt Bridge following I-279 North. (Stay in the left lane on the Ft. Pitt Bridge and in the right lane on the second bridge, the Ft. Duquesne Bridge.) As soon as you pass PNC Park take exit 7C (Chestnut St.) onto Route 28 for about 100 yards, then exit to the right for Chestnut Street. At the end of the exit ramp, turn left on to Chestnut. At the second light, turn right on to Troy Hill Road.

*There is plenty of free parking in the double deck lot behind the buildings or the gravel lot across the street.*

## RECAP OF THE MARCH MEETING

Our March program was hosted by Vickie Pisowicz, co-founder of True North Institute, Inc. Vickie spoke on the topic of the Toyota Production System and how its application can be of extraordinary benefit to organizations working in sectors other than traditional manufacturing. TNII was created to facilitate the application of TPS, with the intent of improving the outcomes and effectiveness of all of its customers, and in the belief that if a critical mass of diverse organizations become involved in TPS implementation, a region can be changed in ways previously unimagined.

Vickie was introduced to the concepts of TPS while she was interning with Alcoa. She had earned Masters degrees in both Business Administration and Public Policy and was interested in making businesses more efficient and productive while at the same time enriching and enhancing the lives of members of the community. Vickie found that TPS offered a solution that met both goals – the principles of the system help business to be more profitable *and* make life better for employees. Alcoa has improved dramatically by studying TPS and now has its own program called the Alcoa Business System. From implementing ABS, it is now 18 times safer to work at Alcoa than many community hospitals!



Vickie was able to witness the effects of TPS by working in the Corporate Finance division of Alcoa. As she studied the technique directly from the people of Toyota, she was able to see how the benefits affected the financial bottom line as well as the lives of people. She was then asked to apply what she had learned about TPS to the health care industry. Vickie refers to TNII as a community resource, a business that operates on non-profit principles and is active in many different sectors including retail grocery, small production facilities and area hospitals.

Vickie's presentation included a short video on the work TNII has done with a local women's shelter. We learned that a process that formerly took the associates of the shelter roughly 32 hours to complete now takes 45 minutes. While the accuracy rate was at 68% while the former method was being used, the new method returns an accuracy rate of 99%. Vickie attributes much of the success to root cause problem solving and active, hands-on work with associates and managers.

Vickie and the other members of TNII are passionate about improvement whether at the corporate level or in the life of each member of our community. TNII offers an executive training experience where business leaders can learn about what TPS is and what it is not. The organization is working directly with Toyota so that improvement and education are constantly in the forefront. Vickie's presentation challenged each of us to consider how we can use our knowledge of IE to serve our community and improve businesses. The IIE Pittsburgh Chapter would like to thank Vickie for hosting us at the TNII offices which was an enlightening and highly informative evening.

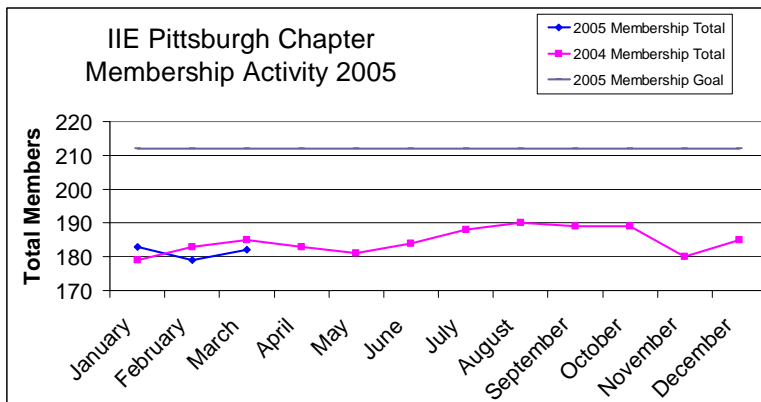
